Welcome to Stockport Academy



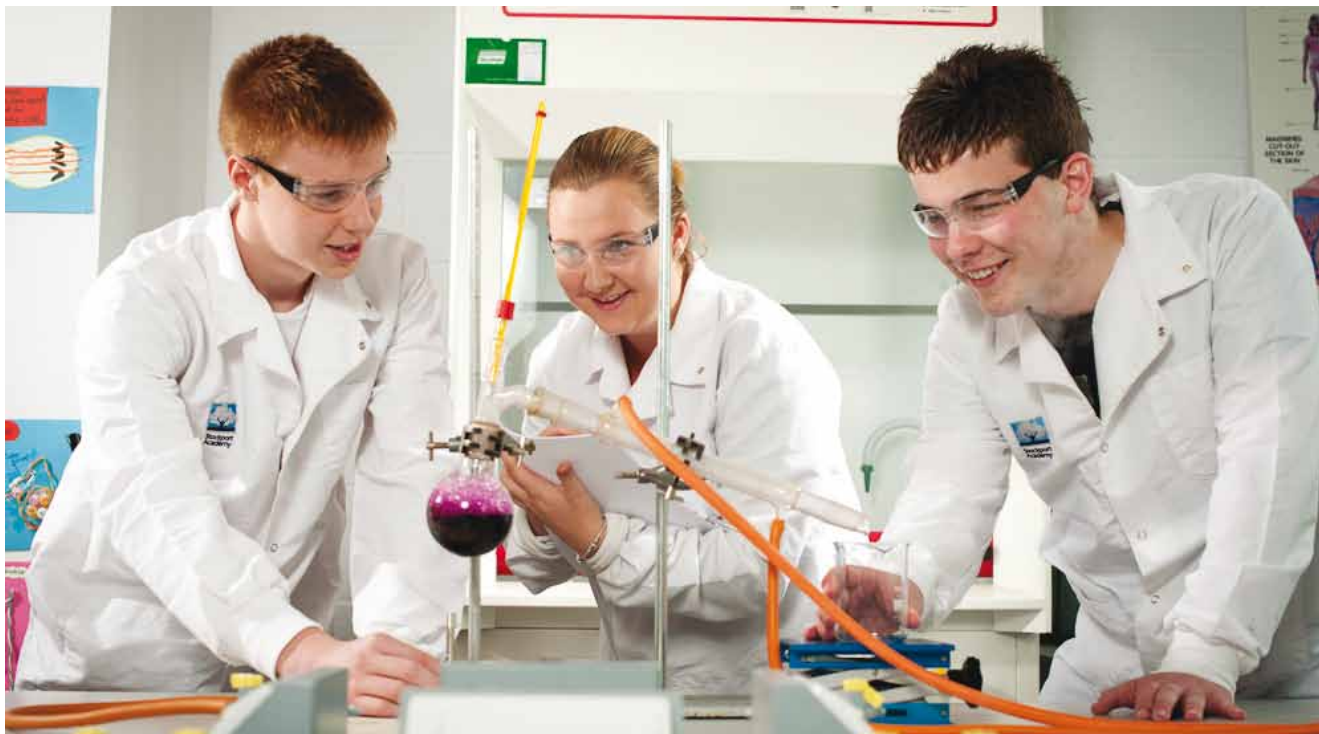

Admissions to Stockport Academy

Stockport Academy serves the Cheadle Heath, Edgeley, Adswold, Bridge Hall and Cale Green areas of Stockport in state-of-the-art buildings on Heathbank Road, Cheadle Heath, Stockport.

Stockport Academy is free of charge and open to students of all abilities and backgrounds and all faiths and none, with 900 places available to students aged 11-16 years (limited to a maximum of 180 places in each school year group). There are also 250 places available in the Sixth Form (limited to 125 per year group).

The criteria for admission into Year 7 is as published in the current Stockport MBC Information for Parents and Carers Guide entitled "Applying for Secondary School".

- a design technology suite with a large vocational training room

- a floodlit all-weather pitch and multi-use games area for tennis, netball and basketball.
