Pastoral and Progress Overview

Your child will receive support from a number of staff in the Academy.

- **FORM TUTOR.** Each child will be allocated to a form and the Form Tutor becomes the first person your child will speak to each day. Form Tutors will monitor progress and behaviour and will be your first point of call if you have a pastoral concern. Your child will be allocated to a Form in May.
- **CLASS TEACHERS.** Each child is allocated a timetable and it will be the responsibility of subject teachers to keep you informed as to progress – through parents' evenings, the report system, postcards of praise, merits and phone calls to discuss poor choices. If your child's bad behaviour escalates in lessons you may be contacted by the Curriculum Area Leader or CAL as they seek to improve staff/student relationships in particular lessons.
- **PASTORAL MANAGER.** Sarah Shaw will be Pastoral Manager (PM) for year 7 and will be the person who looks after your child's general welfare in school. PMs deal with uniform, relationship problems including bullying, mental health and rewards.
- **HEAD OF YEAR (HOY).** Each year has a teaching member of staff who maintains an overview of your child's time in school including any barriers to learning. They will work with you if your child requires additional support in making the right choices.

- **ALL** students will be expected to sign an agreement at the beginning of the year agreeing to the rules of the PE department.
- If a child is injured/unable to participate in PE, they **must still bring their kit** and a note. They will still partake in the lesson as a coach/official.
- It is the PE teacher’s decision whether they get changed into kit or not due to health and safety reasons.
- If they do not bring their kit, even if they have a note to say they are unable to participate, they will be issued with a detention.

Our Expectations

Attendance

Every student is expected to have an attendance of 100%. Every half term you will be given an update on attendance and students who achieve 100% attendance will be eligible for a reward. Students with poor attendance or who are absent without a genuine reason may be visited by the Academy's Family Liaison Officer, Mrs Baker.

Punctuality

Students are expected to be on time for registration every morning. They should make sure they leave home in time to walk to school or catch the bus. Missing a bus or getting up late is not an excuse for being late as it is our role to prepare students for working life where such excuses would not be accepted. Those who are late to school will be given a late slip to attend a lunch time detention for that day. If they do not attend detention they will be collected to do 50 minute detention after school.
