National Nominees - For The Third Time

In addition to our MEN Schools Award win, we were also delighted to be shortlisted for the third time as a NATIONAL Secondary School of this competition back in 2019 and the Year at the tes Schools Awards.

We were named among eight schools from across the country for the honour, and attended the awards ceremony in London back

in May.

We have previously been named as finalists in the same category for 2017, becoming the first Stockport school to achieve this the first time around - a fantastic honour itself.

Prizegiving Returns To Stockport Plaza

Our school community came together to celebrate in style, as we returned to **Stockport Plaza for our first** physical prizegiving ceremony since 2019. After a brilliant performance from our outstanding school choir to open the event, followed by welcome speeches from our Chair of Governors, Mr Robinson, and our Principal, Mrs McCann, we moved on to handing out the first awards of the night. More than 280 trophies were presented over the course of two hours, which recognised achievements in everything from leadership, sports, merits, attendance and much more. No less than ten Year 11

No less than ten Year 11 students were presented with a laptop or iPad on the night in recognition of achieving 5 years of 100% attendance, while another student received a signed and framed Manchester United shirt after winning the inaugural 'Manchester United Foundation Award'.

The trophies were all presented to students by our guest speaker for the night, Figen Murray OBE, who spoke to the audience about the philosophy of 'Ubuntu', or 'I am because we are', which promotes the values of unity and kindness.

Outstanding GCSE Results!



Students and staff celebrated some outstanding GCSE results in August.

An impressive 71% of students achieved a grade 4 or above in English and Maths, with 50%

achieving a grade 5 or above in both subjects. there were some particularly strong performances with a number of students picking up a number of the top grade 9s including:

- -- Daniel Chilvers who achieved seven 9s and two 8s
- Jack Eastwood who achieved three 9s, four 8s and two 7s
- Rabia Afzal who achieved three 9s, four 8s and two 7s.

Principal Mrs McCann said: "This is a fantastic set of results and I am so proud of all the students. They have worked incredibly hard and are a real credit to themselves and our entire school community. We always strive for excellence at Stockport Academy and I am thrilled that so many of our students have the grades they need to move on to college. I wish them all the best for the future. 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Future Me Day

Our latest Future Me day offered a wealth of new opportunities for our students, ranging from high profile speakers to careers advice and practical experiments.

Years 7-10 all had the chance to hear from Figen Murray OBE, the mother of Martyn Hett who was tragically killed during the Manchester Arena bombing in 2017. Figen now works relentlessly to raise awareness of the dangers of online radicalisation, and she shared her experience and what she's learned since with our students who listened intently throughout, before asking their own questions on the topics she had covered. Elsewhere, we had dozens of special guests and agencies spending the day with us to offer some unique workshops for our students.

Year 8 found out more about career paths into nursing and even got to take each other's blood pressure as they learned about some of the roles and responsibilities involved in the job.

Year 9 students developed their job-seeking skills through the Barclays Life Skills programme –





a workshop that covered everything from CV writing to interview techniques. Other workshops throughout the day included topics such as 'Not Going To Uni', careers in STEM and engineering, healthy lifestyles, jobs in the military, jobs in the football sector and a session ran by Fix Up Academy on the dangers and benefits of social media.

Mrs Thandi, careers coordinator, said: "It has been an action-packed day at Stockport Academy and it has been brilliant once again to have such a varied programme of activities on offer for our students.
